Cornmeal Cou-Cou

1 cup corn meal
2 cups water
12 ochroes
salt and black pepper
1 medium size coconut

Grate coconut and pour boiling water over it. Let stand until cool.

Strain and squeeze out milk. Set aside.

Slice ochroes, boil in liquid until soft, and add corn meal (mix in a little water). Stir until it forms a stiff ball.

Cook over slow fire.

When cou-cou is stiff and can hold a peak, pour into a buttered dish and shake in a circular motion, it will form a ball, which you can slice and serve.



Letters to the editor


